# I AM THE BREAD OF LIFE

John 6:25-69

#### **PROLOGUE: The Ancient Name**

- Jesus gets in trouble for calling Himself a name. John 8:58-59
- Exodus 3:14. God's name in Hebrew: *hayah*. Means to <u>exist, to be</u>.
- Four Hebrew consonants were given to represent God's holy name: <u>YHWH</u>
- In Jesus' day, it became known as <u>I AM</u>.
- Jesus' seven "I AM" statements in John. (6:35; 8:12; 10:9; 10:11; 11:25-26; 14:6; 15:5)
- Ultimately, Jesus wants us to trust Him NOT simply for what He could <u>give</u> to us but for WHO He <u>is to be</u> for us!

## SCENE ONE: Bread (John 6:25-52)

• We don't work for <u>grace</u> but in <u>Response to it</u>. Ephesians 2:8-9; Romans 2:4

## SCENE TWO: Misdirection (John 6:53-66)

• Hyperbole and shock were two of Jesus' most utilized teaching tools. Matthew 7:3-5; 5:29-30; 23:15

 With vivid & offensive language (see Gen. 9:4; Lev. 17:14) Jesus speaks about accepting Him at the deepest level; of digesting His <u>character</u> and <u>purpose</u>; His way of truth and grace.

## **SCENE THREE: The Point**

 If you "feed" on Jesus, ingesting all He is, you'll find that for Him, <u>love</u> is the point.
See Matthew 22:36-40; Luke 10:25-37; 15:11-32; John 13:34-35 and 1 John 4:7-8

## SCENE FOUR: Cognitive Dissonance (John 6:67-69)

#### Peter Gives Four Reasons for Choosing to Trust Jesus Without Clarity:

- 1. Hollow options
- 2. Jesus' words Bring Life
- 3. A <u>belief</u>
- 4. A knowing
