Introduction

Jesus, in some of His final words to His disciples before He ascended into Heaven, put forth the marching orders for His followers that have reverberated throughout the centuries for the past 2,000 years. His instructions were simple, clear, pertinent, and orderly. First, His disciples were to go into all the world and make disciples of every nation. This immediately gives them the depth and width of their calling. No border or nationality would be granted an exemption from their travels. They were to cross every known social and ethnic barrier and focus on reaching all of mankind on Christ's behalf. There would be no room for prejudices or excuses.

The second step of the mandate was crystal clear: Anyone whom they had the privilege of meeting, the disciples were to lead into a saving relationship with Jesus and they were to baptize every single believer into the name of the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. No disciple was exempt. If you wanted to be a follower of Jesus, you were to be baptized into His name.

Lastly, after the disciples baptized new believers, they then were to teach them all that Jesus had ever instructed. This means your baptism isn't the end of your journey; it is the beginning of your journey.

Jesus' departing instructions are known as, "The Great Commission," and are found in Matthew 28:18-20. After reading this, we discover in Acts 1 that Jesus then ascended into Heaven, with the disciples all staring at Him as He disappeared into the clouds.

The Bible says in Acts 1:11 that while they were looking up into the sky, two angels appeared. "Men of Galilee," they said, "why do you stand here looking into the sky? This same Jesus, who has been taken from you into heaven, will come back in the same way you have seen him go into heaven."

In other words, "Why are you wasting your time here gawking at the heavens? You only have so much time before the Lord returns in like manner. Shouldn't you get busy obeying His final command to reach the entire world?"

And in case you don't know what happens next, the disciples did in fact heed the angels' words, and the entire Book of Acts records for us the eagerness and intentionality of those first century disciples as they traveled the known and unknown world, striving to disciple and baptize every person they could reach.

Little did we know that today, 2,000 years later, the Church would grow so indifferent to the Great Commission as well as (excuse the pun) watering down the importance of being baptized. Well, there is good news for those of you reading this book, because we are going to examine the true spiritual blessing of being baptized into the name of Jesus. This booklet is the result of a life-long study of what exactly it means to be baptized and what happens when you are baptized.

If you have never been baptized, or if you've ever wondered what the purpose is for someone being baptized, then this study is for you. This will be a five-week journey through the Scriptures that cuts through all the confusion. And hopefully in the end, we will see you in the baptistry as you are buried with Christ and are raised to walk in the newness of life.

We want to start off by asking and answering some of the most basic questions concerning baptism. We know that Christians in the New Testament were baptized as a part of their faith. But let's look closely at who was first baptized, what it means to be baptized, and the pertinent question of "Why do I need to be baptized?"
